BRI is now at its earliest, formative stage. It is not yet active. First year activities will include fund-raising, efforts to inform interested persons and the general public about BRI purposes, and the establishment of an appropriate environment (equipment, facilities, etc) for BRI experiments and related activities.

BRI expects to be fully operational in its second year, when it will conduct laboratory experiments in remote sensing and other areas of human perception. This effort will focus on finding the physical and psychological correlates that will bring these types of human perception and psychokinesis into the mainstream of modern science. It will be supplemented by theoretical research to develop appropriate physical and psychological models for the data observed in the laboratory work.

Commencing in the second year, it will author articles for publication in scientific and popular publications and educate the scientific and general communities through workshops and other traditional approaches.

With specific regard to the envisioned research

- 1) It will primarily consist of "remote viewing" experiments wherein the subject attempts to describe items or surroundings that are beyond his vision.
- 2) BRI research activities have not yet begun.
- 3) Specific research projects are determined by BRI staff who rely on their knowledge of the field, reports of other research, and assessment of what experiments will most contribute to the development of this field.
- 4) Contracted or sponsored research is not contemplated.
- 5) The results of BRI research will be made available to the scientific community and the general population without discrimination.
- 6) Patents, copyrights, and processes, if any, will be owned/or controlled by BRI in terms consistent with its exempt purpose.
- 7) No BRI publications or reports yet exist.
